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

Chairman's Introduction.

Welcome back to the Edinburgh International Print Salon, one of the oldest in the world. After two years of absence due to the Covid pandemic, we are pleased to present our 158th prestigious print-only Salon. Thank you to all entrants for sharing their wonderful images. The entry this year was low leaving the organisers in a bit of a dilemma. Our usual philosophy is to accept the number of images that we can display. For a long time this was fixed to be 202 prints. With entry quantity often in the region of 2500 prints this normally resulted in single digit acceptance rates of around 8% making getting an acceptance at Edinburgh difficult and sought after. With our low entry this year we could have chosen to push up into the heady-heights of a 25% acceptance rate, however our basic philosophy remains getting an acceptance at Edinburgh should not be easy. This year we have therefore reduced our number of accepted images. This results in an acceptance rate of 18%, above our normal range but low by international salon standards. We accepted 160 images and received just over 900 images entered from 22 countries.

Covid dealt a late blow to the selection panel and Chris Hinterobermaier called-



off at the last minute because of it. Our Reserve judge Terry Railley joined the team, with Roger Reynolds and Will Cheung. The selectors did a sterling job and I hope that most of you will agree that, despite the slightly lower number, there is variety and quality for all. As is always the case, it's unfortunate that so many very good images have to be left behind. Many congratulations to those of you who gained awards and acceptances. It is your work that makes the Exhibition a success.

My thanks also to all helpers behind the scenes and for the support from Edinburgh Photographic Society Members whose time and effort is given to make the Salon work.

Without them it just wouldn't happen.

A lot of work goes into organising and running the Salon, however the enjoyment comes from opening the packages and seeing the variety of work entered. Then selection day and the logistics of bringing the prints to the selectors and scoring the images, allocating the awards, notifying the entrants, cataloguing and hanging the resulting exhibition. The fun continues when the exhibition opens and members welcome entrants and visitors from home and abroad. There are acquaintances to be made and to be renewed. There's always some discussion, likes and dislikes and that's part of what makes photography and the camaraderie of the photographic community fun. We look forward to your visit.

Our low entry this year is not unusual as other salons have been experiencing low entry numbers too. A lot is due to Covid. Digital is quick, easy and cheap to send round the world but the quality and aesthetic of a good print can't be beaten! We will be back next year with the 159th Edinburgh International. We look forward to seeing your work.

Panel of Selectors

Roger Reynolds Hon FRPS FBPPA APAGB FBPE (England):

Roger's main passions are the natural world, its landscape, people and the fauna and flora. He also enjoys many other branches of photography from sports to architecture. Since 1995, travel has taken up a major part of his photography. Through his specialist photographic travel company Photoventures he has explored and photographed many locations throughout the world. He has delivered thousands of lectures worldwide. He has judged many competitions including many of the International and National Exhibitions held in the UK. Roger holds many photographic honours including two FRPS Distinctions in Applied and in Pictorial Photography, an APAGB honour for services to photography. In 1998 was the first person to be made a Fellow of the British Photographic Exhibitions and held the only fellowship until the second was awarded in 2001. Elected to the London Salon in 1999 later becoming the Chairman. In the Royal Photographic Society he has served on the Distinctions assessment panels for over two decades, firstly as a member of the Licentiate Panel, then the Applied Panel and in 2001 became Chair of the inaugural Travel Panel. Roger also chaired the Nature Panel and became a member of the RPS Distinctions Advisory Board becoming Chair from 2011-17. He served as a Council member of the Royal Photographic Society, Vice President then President from 2003 to 2005. Throughout his successful photography career, Roger's work has been widely published and awarded internationally.





Will Cheung FRPS (England)

Will is known to many keen photographers in the UK as the current editor of Photography News, a free newspaper available at photo retailers and sent to camera clubs. He formerly also edited Practical Photography, Digital Photo, Photography Monthly and Advanced Photographer. Through his many publications Will has passed on his enthusiasm for photography through technique, creative and technical articles to thousands of photographers over a long career in the industry. Will remains keen to explore his photography and help others. As a Fellow of the Royal Photographic Society, Will sits on the Travel distinctions panel and provides honest, constructive feedback to those seeking RPS distinctions. Will's own photography has him working on themed projects and he can always be found with camera in hand.

Terry Railley EFIAP/d3 ARPS DPAGB (Scotland)

Terry has been a prolific International Exhibitor for several years. He has thousands of acceptances and awards for his photographic work. Former FIAP Liaison Officer for Scotland, Terry sits on the Scotlish Photographic Federation Executive. Terry's main photographic interests lie in Studio portraiture but he is equally at home photographing Nature and Wildlife. His ARPS was in the Travel section, further demonstrating Terry's all round photographic credentials. Membership Secretary and Print Competition Secretary for some years in Edinburgh Photographic Society, Terry has a keen eye for print quality and the paper choice required to elevate an image. Terry helps select the images used to represent EPS in external competitions.





Warren Alani ARPS AFIAP DPAGB ABPE Winner of FIAP Blue Pin for Most Acceptances







Edinburgh Photographic Society held its first Open Exhibition in 1861.



Step forward 160 years to 2021 when EPS held its first digital salon. The 3175 entries were sent from all corners of the world in matters of seconds and were digital images of specified dimensions sent as a series of ones and noughts that would be recreated on an electronic screen. The glamour and experimentation and display of a physical image that was so necessary in 1861, is no longer required. The skills and technology have changed dramatically. That's not to say that digital images are easy nor straight out of camera. Final images are made after the initial captures by light. Careful electronic manipulation to remove distraction, improve contrast and tonal range, convert to mono and perhaps also to be creative, adding elements and crafting the story portrayed. The "seeing" and creation of the final image is an integral part of the photographer's skill is as true today as it was in 1861.

This print exhibition is the 158th Edinburgh International. Two years were lost in the late 1800's and, having survived two world wars, another 2 years were missed in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid. Technology has also changed printing dramatically from those early years. Most prints now received are digital. The same ones and noughts require to be optimised for the printing surface which introduces other considerations and additional difficulty for the photographer. A good quality physical print viewed by reflected light and held in the hand has an aesthetic quality that can't be emulated by the sterile image displayed on an electronic screen. Thank you to all entrants for sharing their printed work and providing us with an excellent Exhibition. EPS is very proud of its continuing support of the printed image and hopes to see you all again next year for the 159th Edinburgh International. Entry is open to all.
